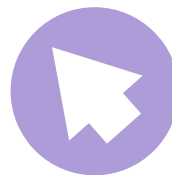

About Expectant Parent Services (EPS)

CFS of Western Manitoba's Expectant Parent Services is a pro-choice program offering supportive pre-natal and post-natal services to expectant parents throughout the City of Brandon and the Agency's Rural catchment area.

Services are provided on a voluntary basis, and include support and assistance to parents, helping them make the best decisions for them and their baby, and connecting with appropriate resources. When parenting is the plan, we provide pre-natal and post-natal education and help to create a supportive network around parents to be.

How to Access Expectant Parent Services

If you or someone you know is expecting a child and would benefit from added support in planning for their pregnancy, contact Child and Family Services of Western Manitoba's intake line during regular business hours to complete the referral process.

An intake worker can help you to determine if the Agency's Expectant Parent Services program is right for you.

Benefits of EPS



The Expectant Parent Services worker can help expectant parents facing difficult decisions through providing information on all options available to them (i.e., termination, adoption, parenting).



In circumstances where adoption is the identified plan, the worker will facilitate the legal requirements for adoptions and counselling of birth parents throughout the adoption proceedings.



The goal of the program is to help parents identify their needs, understand the role of becoming a parent, and help them to prepare and plan for the best future for them and their baby.
